What Reasons (When to), How To File, What to Include

When to File a Report

- Player Ejection (Disqualification) to include second caution
- Fan Ejection
- Coach Ejection (notify board member immediately after match)
- Physical Contact/Violent Conduct
- Verbal Abuse
- Major Injury
- Early Termination
- Field Issues
- Uniform/ball/ball handler issues
- Other??????

How to File a Report

- Go to Referee Resources tab and then Incident Reporting on our web site, TASO-SSA.COM
 - Link: http://www.taso-ssa.com/incident-reporting.html
- Must be done within 24 hours of the incident
- All reports except field and uniform/ball/ball handlers need to be reviewed prior to submission to UIL
 - Steve Duke and Randy Schavrien are assessors and will review the report very quickly and provide suggested improvements if needed

What to Include on the Report

- For player disqualification, need the name and number of the player
 - Hint: take your phone out at halftime and take a picture of the rosters if you are the center or the lead dual
- Include proper terms from the NFHS rule book:
 - For example, Disqualification vs ejection/send off, etc.
- Describe the incident to include how play was stopped and what the restart of play was (direct free kick/kickoff/dropped ball, etc)
- For language, include exactly what was said (we are all adults and have heard worse)
